By signing this Agreement, the foster parent acknowledges that these standards have been reviewed and that the foster family home is in compliance with all safety regulations. Non-compliance with licensing standards regarding pool and water safety will result in an immediate administrative review and assessment for continued use of the home as a foster care resource.
